

Luce/ACLS Program in Religion, Journalism & International Affairs - Fellowships for Scholars

ACLS is pleased to invite applications for fellowships offered through the **Luce/ACLS Program in Religion, Journalism & International Affairs**. This program is made possible by the generous support of the Henry Luce Foundation.

These fellowships are designed for scholars in the humanities and related social sciences who are pursuing research on any aspect of religion in international contexts and who wish to explore ways to connect their specialist knowledge with journalists and media practitioners. The awards support a year of research as well as attendance at workshops and symposia designed to link scholarship and journalistic practice.

ACLS will award up to six fellowships for the 2019-20 academic year. The award carries a stipend of \$55,000, plus \$3,000 for research costs and related scholarly activities, as well as \$5,000 to support short-term opportunities to participate in workshops, trainings, and/or conferences at institutions, research centers, and media organizations that bridge journalism and the academy. The fellowships are portable and are tenable at any US-based college or university.

The deadline for applications is 9pm EDT, **October 24, 2018**. Applications will be accepted only through the ACLS Online Fellowship and Grant Application (OFA) system.
